Purpose and core beliefs

CWN's purpose is to get communities to the future they want through water.

Water is foundational to the health and safety of communities and ecosystems, and central to Canada's economic prosperity. Our collective health and well-being are closely linked to water within urban and rural working landscapes, as well as protected and natural areas. In addition to guiding our actions to achieve water quality, water quantity and biodiversity endpoints, there is a growing recognition that water management is at the heart of many complex challenges. Increasingly, whole-of-society approaches are being used to incorporate more diverse perspectives, identify shared risks and benefits, and advance broader, community-wide goals. CWN enables alignment around water to accelerate progress on societal outcomes.

With this focus on community goals framing CWN's work, there is also a recognition that success must be defined from the perspective of the relevant stakeholders. The desired outcomes and future as envisioned by communities must in turn guide the approaches used and activities undertaken.

CWN is driven by the core beliefs that:

- Aligned and meaningful collaborations involving stakeholders within and beyond the water sector are fundamental to achieving progress on shared goals that are linked to water.
- Advancing these shared goals requires a focus on outcomes as defined by the relevant stakeholders.

Mission and approach

CWN's mission is to enable Canada's water leaders to be at the heart of forging pathways for community success.

Whereas water-related challenges are often regional, national or international in scope, their impacts are acutely felt and experienced at the local level — and the best solutions are frequently regional or local as a result. It is essential that national and global knowledge and experience is brought forward and understood in a way that can best inform decisions. CWN recognizes and serves that need.

The broader context and knowledge base relating to shared challenges is critical for framing a clear understanding of the regional and local issues and needs, as well as the decisions faced by leaders within and beyond the water sector. CWN provides credible insights and learnings based on Canadian and international experience to improve the ability of water leaders to consider, position and convey the basis and rationales for their decisions.

Given the centrality of water to the health, safety and prosperity of Canadian communities, CWN believes that water organizations are natural leaders for making progress on shared challenges. CWN initiatives provide opportunities for collaboration among Canada's water leaders, facilitate connections to leaders in other sectors with a shared interest in water, and enable collective progress toward shared goals.

Clarify possibilities for progress through water


